Online: Apply or renew online by using COMPASS. With COMPASS, you can also check your eligibility before you apply.

Telephone: Call the Consumer Service Center for Health Care Coverage at 1-866-550-4355.

In-person: Visit your local county assistance office.

Mail: Download, print, and mail the Pennsylvania Application for Benefits to your county assistance office.

Medicaid – Waiver Information
