New Year, New Point-in-Time (PIT) Count.

The annual PIT count is the survey that the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) uses, in partnership with your local <u>Continuums of Care (CoC)</u>, to count how many unsheltered individuals are experiencing homelessness in your community. This process is essential for determining funding allocations to programs that offer homelessness prevention services.

Volunteers and community service organizations are crucial in supporting local

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beds and shelter conduct a Housing Inventory Count (HIC) to contribute to the comprehensive understanding of the homelessness landscape.

Why is the PIT Count conducted in January? Each CoC has flexibility in how they do their count; however, <u>HUD mandates</u> that the count takes place in the last ten days of January. During this time, Shelters are most likely to be full, since this is considered the coldest period of the year. Counting at this time should be measuring the community's unmet needs, but there is still a chance to miss the people that are couch surfing or temporarily doubled up with friends.
